Executive Summary

BC Foreign Language Department

The Foreign Language Department provides courses in ASL, Japanese, and Spanish that satisfy core general education requirements for career pathways in workforce associate degrees and in satisfying transfer requirements for the CSUs and UCs. The department also offers advanced courses in Spanish and American Sign Language for students pursuing language studies as a major. Courses within Foreign language transfer to all CSU and UCs in addition to many other universities. Courses satisfy both major requirements as well as general education requirements. Spanish and ASL courses fortify student success by allowing students to earn an AA degree at BC. In addition, nearly all courses in the department allow students to satisfy general education requirement for graduation and transfer.

With few exceptions, success and retention rates in all three disciplines exceed statewide averages over the past five years. Employment for language interpreters and translators shows healthy growth potential according to the State of California Employment Development Department. The 2010-2011 Course Book Summary indicates that the department has improved in almost all key indicator areas, including census enrollment, ending enrollment, FTES, FTEF, and productivity. Due to pedagogically-mandated low enrollment rates (30 students per section), the department is slightly below the college average for productivity; however, it is improving. The department exceeds the college average in both retention and success.

Foreign Language has led the way in trimming away non-essential and low-performing courses. In the past, Foreign Language has eliminated ASL B5, placed the French Program on hiatus, and eliminated all conversation and specialty courses. We now offer only three languages, ASL, Japanese, and Spanish, for a total of 13 unique courses. All courses transfer as major courses, general education courses, or elective courses. The overwhelming majority of courses are taught by full-time faculty. Spanish is now finalizing native speakers' curriculum to better serve these students. As a Hispanic-serving institution, we have a large number of native speakers. In addition, Spanish has begun working on the Spanish TMC even before it has been finalized. It is on track to be one of the first in the state.




