

CA Govt Code 3543 (a) Compensation & working conditions

- School calendar;
- Compensation;
- Wages;
- Hours of employment;
- Terms and conditions of employment health and welfare benefits;
- Leave;
- Transfer and reassignment policies;
- Safety conditions;
- Class size;
- Procedures for evaluation of employees;
- Organization security;
- Procedures for processing grievances;
- Layoff procedures;
- Alternative compensation or benefits for employees adversely affected by pension limitations;
- Additional compensation or salary schedule based on criteria other than years of training and experience.

AB 1326 (Arambula) - 2021

Requires county human services agencies to designate a staff liaison as a point of contact for higher education counselors.

AB 2884 (Berman) - 2020


Allows districts to use restricted lottery funds for student basic needs.

AB 595 (Medina) - 2019

Allows undocumented students to use an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) in lieu of a social security number when enrolling in career education programs with a background check component.

AB 706 (Low) - 2019

Eliminates the three year time limit on the transfer of sick leave between districts.

Webinar Description:

Over the past decade, the California Community Colleges have undergone dramatic changes resulting from legislative reform and the budget process. While the legislation is well-intended, it may not address the problem it is trying to fix, and in fact, legislative changes often have unintended consequences affecting student success. As future legislation is imminent, it is essential for faculty to be strong advocates at the state level with a fundamental understanding of policy development. This webinar will cover the role of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges. the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, various system partners, and outside advocacy groups and how they influence state-level policy development. The webinar will begin with the nuts and bolts of the state legislative process, provide assistance in following and tracking legislation, and then focus on sharing the voice of faculty with confidence to connect with local state-wide representatives effectively. AB 928 (Berman) Transfer Process and Reform Passed

- Intersegmental HE Oversight Committee charged with improving transfer
- Singular GE Pathway CSU GE Breadth and IGETC
 - Limit of 34 units
 - How will this change course taking patterns and enrollments
- Auto placement in ADTs
 - doesn't address the barriers to transfer



AB 1111 (Berman) Common Course Numbering Passed

- Require the establishment of a common course numbering system for all GE and transfer pathway courses throughout the CCCs by July 1, 2024;
- Urge the common course numbering workgroup (see above) to consider starting with courses in the current C-ID system and expand from there.

Trailer Bill Language California Budget 2021-22

 Allocate \$10 million to the CCCCO to form a workgroup to support the development and implementation of a common course numbering system throughout the CCCs.
