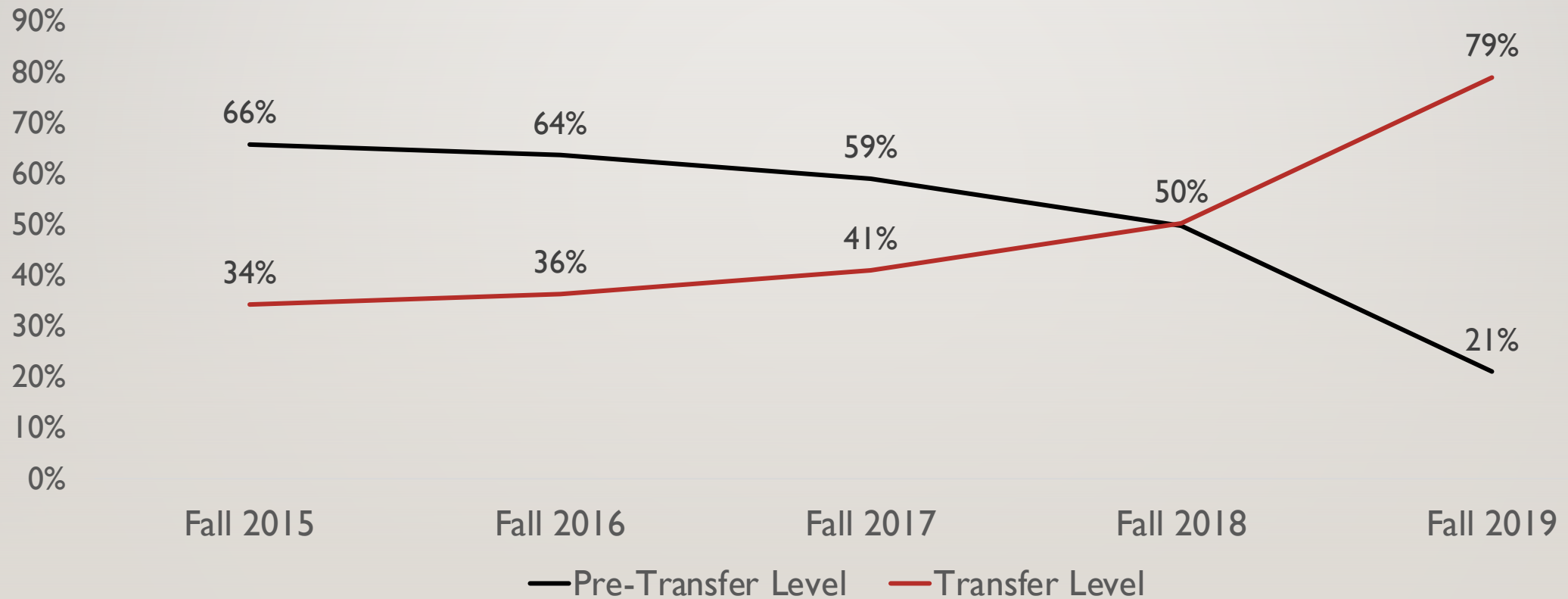

AB 705 REVIEW

- Became law in January 2018
- Implemented in phases, targeting improving student throughput in English, EMLS and Math courses based on high school GPA data
- Based on state and local data, students have higher throughput success if enrolled directly into transfer level English and Math
- AB 705 Taskforce & Faculty collaborated on best implementation strategies and began phasing out pre-transfer level courses
- Created co-requisite laboratory enhanced courses (ENGL BIAL, MATH BIAL, MATH B22L)
- Moving toward full implementation by Fall 2022
- English & Math Validation of Practices and Improvement Plan Due to CCCCO mid-March 2022

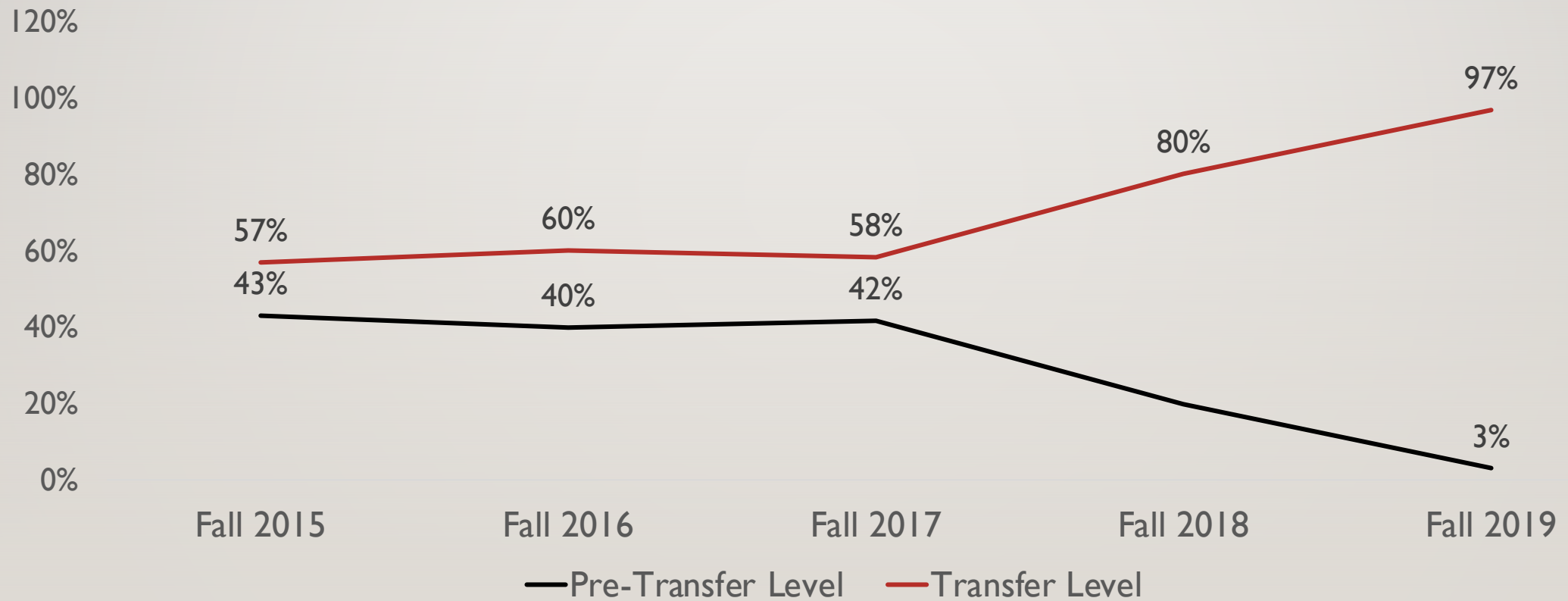
TRANSFER-LEVEL AND PRE-TRANSFER MATH

97% of English Writing Sections at Transfer-level as of Fall 2019



MATH & ENGLISH

- Increasing “just-in-time” support with laboratory enhanced transfer level courses
- Math & English Success Advisory Team
- Boot-camp style NC support courses
- Embedded support in transfer level courses (WC model)
- Increased sections of transfer level and transfer level with support courses

MATH

- Math Learning Center: new non-credit support course MATH B7INC
- STEM Study Group Leaders
- MESA online tutoring
- Peer Tutoring Center
- Student Success Lab (open entry NC Plato modules)
- TECM B52 and MATH B72 will be modified as transfer-level

ENGLISH

- Writing Center / Embedded Support
- Faculty led BIAL Community of Practice workshop
- Peer Tutoring Center
- Student Success Lab (open entry NC Plato modules)
- ENGL B99NC “On-Demand/Just-In Time” Rolling English Boot-camp

ENGLISH ROLLING BOOTCAMPS (ENGL B99NC)

- Faculty Leads will create Canvas content modules, advertise to students, provide support to faculty
- Community of Practice Workshops for faculty to share best practices
- Faculty can create tailored boot-camp content or build from content modules
- One week intensive courses scheduled, as needed, on different topics, throughout semester based on student need
- Example Boot-camps: Outlining, Works Cited, Grammar, MLA Format, etc.
- Will be piloted in spring & summer with full implementation in Fall 2022
