Ian Juarez: I am activities manager Ian Juarez and I also work in the office of student life in production.


#### 5. INDIVIDUAL REPORTS

#### 6. NEW BUSINESS

  - i. Welcome week

#### Discussion:

Director Garcia: This year we will be focusing our attention on the 4 main weeks of events which are going to be welcome week, welcome back week, spring fling week, and homecoming week. I have a list of events already, and I already submitted the event proposals along with them. Keep in mind we can always add, take out, or slightly modify events. I want this to be a great and fun experience for all of us. These events are in there first year, so it should be fun planning them for the very first time. Let us start with welcome week. The theme for this event is reign of the renegades. On Monday of that week, I want a booth out on entrances around campus. I vision donuts and juice being available, as well as BCSGA officers handing them out.

President Frazer: It would be great if we could have flyers made to advertise the events for the week.

*Senator Bernal*: I think this is also a great way to possibly recruit new senators as well. We would be able to inform them on student government and how to participate.

*Director Garcia*: Ms. Wright brought to my attention that we could also invite other departments to explain what they do on campus.

Ian Juarez: I am going to be in charge of filling out the intake forms for this event.

Director Garcia: I am going to try to get the cheer team and drumline to do some performance around 12:00 p.m. because it is lunchtime and most students will be out there. This will help keep students excited for the week.it is also a great way to promote the cheer team and drumline. I know it may be difficult to get a hold of the cheer team and drumline, but I will try and get this figured out.

*Ian Juarez*: I am trying to get Calie and the spirit team to get in contact with the athletic department. She says she knows one of the cheer coaches on campus. Maybe you can go and meet with them.

*Director Garcia*: Moving on to Tuesday, I still want to have juice and donuts, but I also want to hand out water bottles stuffed with flyers, pencils, and erasers. I saw them online. You buy the water bottle, put the BC sticker on them, and then stuff things in there beneficial to students.

Ms. Wright: I think you should do some research on different departments and the different types of aide that are offered, like financial aid. If there is a student pending aid, they can get a book voucher to help pay for their books so that they are not strained academically. These departments may already have flyers made advertising their department, so you would not have to create them.

Director Garcia: Moving on to Wednesday. I want there to be a big Renegade Carnival. We do have a DJ from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. I do not believe the BCSGA is paying for it. Arisve has it booked and there is a contract with the DJ. We will not have to worry about that. It would be great to get a few clubs to participate and host a few games. Maybe this event can also be geared towards a fundraising event for clubs. A ticket system can be implemented to help them raise money for their own club if they choose to participate. I will have to talk to ICC to further plan this out. That would require a lot of help to do. I know we have had a mechanical bull, and a bounce house. I know kids love the bounce house. I want to create a fun and positive environment.

*Senator Salcido*: When does welcome back week occur? The only reason I ask is because I think it would be difficult to get club participation in the first week because most of their focus will be on welcome back week.

*President Frazer*: What we could do is bring this up at the next ICC meeting we have, and gain input from club representatives.

Ian Juarez: I think a simpler solution would be to focus the first week on the resources and departments that are crucial to students. The second week can be focused on clubs and organizations as well as other available resources. Hopefully this eliminates strain from either week. It would be more focused towards students. I also want to include that on your Knights Carnival you should talk to the pantry and do a pack the pantry awareness to let students know it exists. We would also be able to get donations and contributions.

Ms. Wright: I want to follow up on the comment made regarding the first and second week. If I am correct, the second week is club week. As Ian stated, if you focus you efforts on departments and resources, the expectation is that in that second week clubs will already be participating. You would be able to facilitate some volunteers to your booth.

Director Garcia: On Thursday, I had a taco truck and a band coming to play. We did have a taco truck for that day, but I think their contract has expired. We will have music, but we have to replace the taco truck. I am opening that spot up. We could do something different and bring pizza from outside.

President Frazer: All food has to go through Food Service first. They get first priority. If they decline the event, then you are allowed to get food from outside. There are some steps that you have to follow before you can seek services from outside services. The band that we have coming is called Stereo Citizen. They are going to be on Warped Tour this year. I am not sure what the cost of having them is, but I will talk to Dr. Damania about that.

*Senator Salcido*: I know that when we had a band last year, there were a few noise complaints. A lot of them came from the stage area.

President Frazer: All we have to do is notify everyone that the band is coming on that Thursday, and then we can carry on with the event. That would mean letting anyone holding a meeting near the place know so they have time to change their meeting location, hold it, or delay it.

Senator Bernal: I have been reaching out to staff members on campus for students who are AB540. I think a lot of resources for these student need to be made more aware of. Maybe we can get someone who focuses on dreamers and the stuff they are able to qualify for. I have met students who get stuck and do not know what to do.

Ms. Wright: That is a great point. We are working on developing a safe zone training for dreamers. It is still in the development stage. There are faculty members that support these efforts and they have a link on their website that I can point you towards.

President Frazer: For welcome week, please make sure to make yourselves available. I will be notifying everyone on BCSGA to help volunteer for the week. There will be a lot of work that has to be done. Get your schedule figured out, get your homework done. We are going to be short on volunteers.

*Ian Juarez*: I spoke with Dr. Damania and was notified that the intake form must be filled 21 days before the event happens. As long as I get all the information in time, I will submit it.

## Discussion:

*Director Garcia*: There is a bond going on during homecoming. It is a fund to build more classrooms for the school and renovate some of the buildings here. This is something that should be supported. We are going to want to find a way to incorporate that support for homecoming without making it the main focus.

Director Garcia: On Monday we will have a Quidditch game. If you win, then students can get prizes. Tuesday we have knocker balls, where students can run into each other and bounce around. From what I have read they send someone down to help moderate the use of the knocker balls. On Wednesday, I want to have

I have a Mexican culture event that I wanted M.E.CH.A club to host, showcasing the culture with traditional dance. I have an event planned for March 14,2016 where people will be able to get a pie crust and fill it with whatever flavor they want.

Senator Salcido: I know a pie day was being held by one of the clubs on campus last year and the event ran into complications. I would try and find out what those complications were and start figuring out how to get past that.

*Ms.Wright*: You could also get in contact with any NAACP organization that may be here on campus and see if there is an event they would like to participate in.
