Fulks asked the Council to think of the <u>Renegade Road Map</u> to be a framework that brings the various BC initiatives together in a way that feels more coordinated than ever before.

Fulks presented information on the four pillars of the pathways:

- Clarify: Clarify Pathways (Mapping pathways to student end goals)
- Intake: get students on pathways
- Support: keeping student on pathways with intrusive advising and support
- Learning: learning with intentional outcomes



Fulks then asked the Council to provide input on the Renegade Road concept.

- Suggestion to over-communicate the concept at each opportunity
 - o Fulks is available to present at other meetings
 - o EAC will hold area meetings to promote concept and faculty involvement
 - o Follow-up on institute held over the summer
 - o Opportunity develop structural changes in communication about the concept
