

SB 769 Key Facts

- Expands California's pilot baccalaureate program from 15 to 30 programs
- Eliminates limitation of one program per college
- Lessens non-duplication requisite from statewide to only within 100 miles
- Extends the statewide baccalaureate degree pilot program "indefinitely".

Affordable Bachelor's Degree

- CCC upper division cost to student = \$130/unit (\$46/unit + \$84/upper division unit). Fifteen units of upper division classes at BC costs the student \$1969 including fees.
- Fifteen units of classes at CSUB costs the student \$3428.25

- Cost to taxpayer is much less for CCC bachelor's than CSU or UC bachelor's:
 - CC League's Fast Facts 2016 gives the following per FTES funding from all taxpayer sources (see <http://ccleague.org/files/public/Publications/FF2016.pdf>):
 - CCC = \$7897
 - CSU = \$14,120
 - UC = \$24,788
 - 120 units bachelor's degree = 8 FTES (at 15 units/FTES), so institution's cost to taxpayer = 8 x \$/FTES:
 - CCC = \$63,176 (= 56% that of CSU and 32% that of UC)
 - CSU = \$112,960
 - UC = \$198,304
