Christian asked Council members to make note and attend two events:

- The April 13th KCCD Board of Trustees Meeting
- The April 28th College Promise Announcement

Christian highlighted new legislation that was being developed to:

- Expand the number of baccalaureate offerings and
- Expand Teacher credentialing programs to California community colleges.

As part of BC's accreditation self-evaluation process, Christian highlighted four accreditation standards that the college might need to do some focused work on.

I.B.6: The institution disaggregates and analyzes learning outcomes and achievement for subpopulations of students. When the institution identifies performance gaps, it implements strategies, which may include allocation or reallocation of human, fiscal and other resources, to mitigate those gaps and evaluates the efficacy of those strategies.

II.A.9: The institution awards course credit, degrees and certificates based on student attainment of learning outcomes. Units of credit awarded are consistent with institutional policies that reflect generally accepted norms or equivalencies in higher education. If the institution offers courses based on clock hours, it follows Federal standards for clock-tocredit-hour conversions. (ER 10)

III.A.5: The institution assures the effectiveness of its human resources by evaluating all personnel systematically and at stated intervals. The institution establishes written criteria for evaluating all

personnel, including performance of assigned duties and participation in 2 institutional responsibilities and other activities appropriate to their expertise. Evaluation processes seek to assess effectiveness of personnel and encourage improvement. Actions taken following evaluations are formal, timely, and documented.

III.A.6: The evaluation of faculty, academic administrators, and other personnel directly responsible for student learning includes, as a component of that evaluation, consideration of how these employees use the results of the assessment of learning outcomes to improve teaching and learning.

SB769

Nick Strobel shared <u>Key Facts</u> of this emerging legislation that would allow community colleges to expand the number of baccalaureate offerings. The <u>full Senate Bill language</u> is posted on the College Council website as well. Matt Garrett and Nick Strobel are engaged in Research to support this legislation. It was noted that BC is well positioned to compete for a second baccalaureate offering.

- Interested departments should start their development work and indicate their interest to participate.
- GE for upper division: capacity may not be there at CC; perhaps online ed initiative to provide this coursework—BC should plan on positioning ourselves to compete for this opportunity
- BC is making a positive impact to our community by providing qualified, local workforce
