Commiso reviewed the process of Strategic Directions as a three-year cycle which renews in 2018. Each fall the reports provide an update on progress on each of the initiatives. AIO compiles and analyzes the reports, creates a summary and reports to College Council. Highlights from the presentation:

- Progress is noted with three status indicators: in progress, completed, etc.
- Submission rate for spring 2017 is 83%. Nine reports are still outstanding
- Learned that wording of the initiatives should be revisited, collaboration on completing the reports in beneficial, and need to do more work to embed the reporting into the work of the committees.
- Suggestions for the future:
 - o Identify one specific person responsible for each initiative
 - Standardize the scoring
 - o Increase faculty involvement
 - o Provide guidance to committees on keeping strategic directions on agendas
 - Create a structure where college plans direct the strategic directions of the district office.

Closing the Loop

- o Include productivity number in this analysis
- Note the evolution of Closing the Loop over the past few years; proud of this increased transparency
- Evaluate our policies for online courses; CC has cap of political science of 40; BC has a cap of 120.
- Rely on faculty in each discipline to determine the appropriate class size; need to evaluate class sizes- those in faculty contract were not necessarily developed with distance education in mind; class size based on discipline is important

Holmes and Vaughn reported from the Consultation Council meeting of April 25, 2017:

• Began review of Chapter 7 – began this review

- Did not yet address Chapter 2; Holmes has drafted policies related to the Chancellor and college President
- Tentative Budget:
 - o District office is proposing an increase of \$600,000 for 2017-18;
 - \$275,000 due to step increases and STRS contributions
 - remaining due to newly proposed positions
 - Funding two ERP positions through SSSP; Cerro Coso may contribute to a portion of one position
- Tobacco free procedure will be added to next agenda.
