- The task force is charged with gathering and reviewing information and providing a recommendation to College Council
- This structure will represent mission, vision and values of the college
- Final recommendation will come to College Council in February
- Timeline is aggressive and short; three phases are outlined in the posted document
- Great effort to gather input from various area on management needs; task force will visit primary governance and leadership groups and the Delano campus
- Organizational chart provides a legend; Non-GUO01 funded positions do not impact the 50% Law. BC operated at approximately 64% in 2016-17

 - o The overall target for BC is 1726 FTES from the 320-IR reconciliation report.. Based on the fall 2017 actual performance we revised the targets to: Fall 2017 - 241; Spring 2018 - 485 and Summer 2018 - 1000
 - o Budget Committee will engage with the growth reports and report back to the Council
 - o Spring growth is very positive; would like to see additional growth of 122ftes
 - Outreach is focused on continuing students to ensure
- Online Education Initiative (OEI) is expanding the cohort of pilot colleges. BC will submit an application to participate. Deadline is December 15, 2017
- Chancellor Oakley memo promotes civic engagement through voter registration efforts

Accreditation ISER: Standard IB, Academic Quality

Strobel directed the Council the draft document posted to the College Council website and highlighted the components of the Standard as noted below. https://committees.kccd.edu/sites/committees.kccd.edu/files/CC 2017-18 Standard1B-PresentationCollegeCouncil.pdf

- Standard #1: We have an authentic, rich dialog about student outcomes, equity, academic quality, our effectiveness, and how to improve student learning and achievement.
- Standard #2: We assess (measure) SLOs for all programs, student support services and academic learning support services.
- Standard #3: We establish college-level standards (metrics) for student achievement, assess (measure) how well we're achieving those standards and publish the results of that assessment.
- Standard #4: We use the assessment data of Standards IB2+IB3 to structure how we do things to make sure college-level learning happens and so students can achieve their goals (degree/certificate and/or transfer).
- Standard #5: We evaluate how well we're carrying out our mission through a systematic, objective, thorough process ("program review") and we measure that for different program types (degrees or certificates) and mode of delivery (face-to-face and distance ed).
- Standard #6: We measure how well learning and achieving of educational goals (degree/certificate and/or transfer) is happening among various student populations, we fix the gaps found between student populations and then measure the efficacy of the fix(es).
- Standard #7: We regularly evaluate our policies and practices all across the college to make sure we're as effective as we can be in supporting academic quality and achieving our mission.
- Standard #8: We communicate the results of our assessments and evaluations to everyone at the college, so that everyone understands our strengths and weaknesses in order to have the authentic dialog of Standard IB1 needed to set appropriate priorities.
- Standard #9: We continually and systematically evaluate, plan, and execute what needs to be done to accomplish our mission and continually improve our effectiveness and academic quality.
