# Welcome and Overview of Agenda

# **Approval of Minutes**

A motion was made by Wojtysiak and seconded by Moreland to approve the minutes as presented.

#### **President's Report**

Dadabhoy directed the Council to the posted report and supplemental documents, and noted the recognition from Campaign for College Opportunity as a Champion of Higher Education

#### **Early College Update**

Hayward and Swanson shared data related to early college, and shared the following about the class of 2018:

- 75 students signed up for the Ag Prep program at Wonderful College
- 25% are Latino students
- 85% are first generation students
- 38 students qualified for graduation
- 28 students awarded an Associate's Degree

It was noted that to advance equitable baccalaureate attainment, the college must expand its outreach and programming in rural communities.

It was suggested to make this report a regular item for College Council and to incorporate this information into the annual State of the College.

It was also suggested that SGA and the Academic Senate invite the team to present in the spring.

#### **Meta-Major Pathway Report - Education**

Chapman introduced the team including Wojtysiak and Castaneda, and shared his passion and enthusiasm for the students in this pathway.

Wojtysiak reviewed the momentum point data for the pathway, highlighting completion of 15 units the first term, and 30 units the first year.

Castaneda noted that of the 1800 Summer Bridge students approximately 1500 of those students are part of the Finish in Four program. Castaneda shared the high-touch practices she implements as the Ed Advisor in the pathway and highlighted the 99% completion rate of financial aid applications.

# State of the College

Christian reminded the Council that the State of the College document is an annual report the college provides to the Board of Trustees. The document provides a summary of the previous academic year's accomplishments and is reviewed by College Council annually.

Hroch reviewed the document and highlighted

- Early college
- Accreditation
- Tutoring center
- Counseling student contact data shows that most students
- Financial aid; cost per student has decreased the last three years

There is newly incorporated section of Innovation and Leadership highlighting many initiatives at BC such as: Guided Pathways Leadership, Program Mapper and data coaching.

The State of Bakersfield College is strong!

#### **Closing the Loop**

Giacomini reminded the Council the document was initially presented on November 1, 2019. Closing the Loop is an annual report provided twice a year outlining how the work of the college drives the budget decisions.

## **Strategic Directions Mid-year Report**

Coston directed the Council to the posted report and reviewed the status of the initiatives within each of the four strategic directions: Student Learning, Student Progression & Completion, Facilities & Technology, and Leadership and Engagement. Coston also noted that 15 of the initiatives are complete as of Fall 2019.

## Program Review, Report on Annual Process

Waller, Nickell and Rabe directed the Council to the posted materials and reviewed the purpose of this annual report is to:

- Summarize themes and trends among the 105 program reviews
- Facilitate the resource allocation process by providing information to aide decision-making
- Share observations and trends identified through the process

- Create a Program Review process with a timeline and milestones to make the work a continuous process
- Create the 3-Year Comprehensive cycle in eLumen
- Develop a program review that is relevant to hybrid programs that are both instructional and non-instructional- Umoja, Library
- Provide better eLumen guides and examples of exemplary program reviews.
- Program Review rubric
- Workshops:
  - · department specific eLumen/Program Review
  - Data/Tableau
  - Administrative Unit Outcomes
- ASCCC-create a program review that ties in with Guided Pathways and Student Support Services

- Consider the questions less isolated and connect:
  - Guided Pathways
  - Student Support Services
  - Equity and disproportionate impact
  - CCCC Vision for Success
- Refine questions
  - Goals
  - Assessment
- Reformat eLumen questions and feedback sections
- Give relevant and constructive feedback...hold programs accountable
