BC Awarded \$1.3 Million TRIO Grant

A \$1.3 million grant from the US Department of Education will support aspiring educators in our Teacher Preparation Pathway. The TRIO grant will support 700 first-generation college students in their goal of becoming teachers, which will improve diversity in the field. They'll receive academic support, networking opportunities and help preparing for their CBEST and CSET credentialing tests. Kimberly Bligh is leading this work along with BC's education department to help us alleviate Kern County's shortage of STEM teachers while promoting diversity in the teaching field. BC Awarded \$3 Million Title V Developing Hispanic Serving Institutions Grant

In recognition of Bakersfield College's significant work to advance student completion and workforce readiness, the college has been awarded \$3 million in Title V funding to catalyze efforts to address disparities in quality health care access throughout Kern County. Bakersfield College will leverage grant dollars to bolster existing efforts designed to address shortages in the health care workforce made more visible due to the COVID-19 pandemic. By expanding the college's footprint of health sciences pathways through Early College, transfer pathway agreements, and strong partnerships with health care providers and community organizations, BC will systematically strengthen Kern's education-to-


BC Nominated for Several Beautiful Bakersfield Awards

Data Snippet: Reducing Excess Unit Accumulation

Today, our graduates are completing their degrees with fewer units - on average, 6.9 units less that just four short years ago. Our ADT students graduate with even fewer excess units - 76.4 units - a stark contrast to the 91.1 units AA/AS students were graduating with in 2016-17.



Not only does this reduction in unit accumulation advance our progress toward the CCCCO's Vision for Success, it results in less time and money to degree completion.

At \$46/unit, the average cost to AA/AS completion was \$4,160.60 in enrollment fees alone in 2016-17. Since 2016, we have significantly scaled our ADT offerings, which now represent BC's primary awards to graduates. This shift in focus, combined with a more clear, direct path to completion, graduates today pay an average of \$3,513.40 for an Associate Degree for Transfer. This is a \$647.50 savings to the student. With approximately 1,500 ADT graduates, this represents a \$971,250 savings to taxpayers.
