Bakersfield College has been approved as a COVID-19 vaccination site and we are eagerly waiting to hear when we will be designated our first shipment of vaccines.

Over the past number of weeks, there has been great work done by Kern County Public Health to expedite the rollouts, but there is still much more to be done. Throughout this pandemic, we have been committed to being a part of the solution, offering our community ways to stay informed and engaged. We are now proud to step up and offer our campus, the home of the Renegades, as the next vaccination site in Kern County. Our institutional commitment to academic quality, student support, and community engagement remains uncompromised thanks to the work of many devoted faculty and staff using innovative tools.

Our planning team is working on multiple vaccination events which are contingent upon vaccine availability. Once Kern County Public Health announces an allotment for Bakersfield College, we will send an email notice to all BC employees. The email could come as early as this week. As the vaccine becomes more available, the campus is looking to be utilized as a mass vaccination clinic as early as the beginning of March. We are also working to design a plan that would bring pop up clinics to both Delano and Arvin.

President's Virtual Seminar Series with Dr. Michael Saag

On February 2, BC welcomed Dr.
Michael Saag, a dean of global health at the University of Alabama-Birmingham to help educate our community about the coronavirus. Dr. Saag provided simple explanations about how specifically the virus attacks the



body and the efficacy of vaccines. He also answered questions from BC Pre-Med Student Ian Spark and Public Health Sciences student Kassandra Sweeney about his Washington Post article, "Even With a Vaccine, This Virus will Take Time to Conquer," which describes how the body takes time to develop a "memory" of how to fight a new infection during the immunization process.

Data Snippet

Bakersfield College has been widely recognized and emulated for its data coach program. The Chancellor's Office, the Career Ladders Project, and the Continuous Learning Institute among others have praised the innovative program for empowering a wide array of college faculty and staff and enabling them to support student success in data-focused ways. For example, data coaches have received training on how to identify students who are have not yet completed a math or English class and follow up with them to encourage their completion of key guided pathways momentum points. As part of their continuous review and improvement process, the Office of Institutional Effectiveness recently completed a survey of 43 faculty and staff who participated in BC's Data Coach program in Fall 2020. Twenty-three (53%) of the data coaches responded to the survey. Twenty of the respondents (87%) indicated that they had attended two or more training events in fall 2020 and 91% indicated that they were satisfied with the training. Other highlights from the survey include the following:

- 100% were familiar with the 1st year guided pathways momentum points.
- 91% knew how to obtain data on guided pathways momentum points.
- 74% knew how to access data coach reports in Cognos.
- 91% of data coaches indicated that they knew how to manipulate data in Excel.
- 83% knew how to create figures and graphs in Excel.
- 87% were comfortable using Starfish to access data on students.
