

Veteran Students:

38,006 veterans in service area.

Currently, 593 veteran students have self-identified at Bakersfield College with 130 having certified for VA benefits through the VRC.

Our goal is to recruit those who are not yet enrolled and support current students with the greatest need.


Eligibility

150 veteran students per year with the highest need as evidenced by transcripts, test scores, interview and assessment. Total served 450 students over the life of the grant.

- ☐ Identified as veterans (DD214)
- ☐ Enrolled in Fall semester who demonstrate academic need based on grades
- ☐ Have multiple measure indicating needed support
- ☐ Continuing students who have a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or lower and/or
- ☐ Students with disability status

ENROLLMENT

Increase enrollment each academic year throughout grant period and beyond.


PERSISTENCE (retention)


