

# **Data Snippet: Community College Enrollment across the United States**

Community college enrollments around the country and the state have tumbled by around 10% relative to last spring. At BC, we have been fortunate in that, while our FTES has also dropped, it has not dropped as severely as at other institutions (-6%). Our response to the pandemic and enrollment declines have involved many elements such as increasing both broad-based support (e.g., implementing a chatbot for the BC website, running a virtual welcome center) and targeted support (e.g., data-based calling campaigns from affinity groups and pathway groups) that show BC's philosophy of high tech/high touch support. Additionally, we have drilled down into our spring 2021 enrollment data, seeking a better understanding of which students are being most affected by the pandemic and why.

When we disaggregate by age group, we see that we have primarily lost enrollments from younger students. This trend is keeping with national reports that show that college-going rates among first-time students plummeted by 20% in 2020-2021. The data shows a strong uptick in enrollment among older students suggesting that we may be seeing the beginning of a wave of older workers who have been displaced by the pandemic and who are now seeking to upskill and reskill in order to be competitive in the labor market.
