9/8/2022	Kinesiology Associate in Arts for Transfer	<p>The Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer (AA-T) is intended for all students who plan to complete an Associate in Arts in Kinesiology. This degree is especially valuable for those students planning on completing a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology at a CSU campus because the Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer guarantees admission to the CSU system (but not to a particular campus or major).</p> <p>Students transferring to a CSU campus that does accept the Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a bachelor's degree (unless the major is a designated "high-unit" major).</p> <p>This degree may not be the best option for students intending to transfer to a particular CSU campus or to university or college that is not part of the CSU system. Chávez Leadership	<p>The César Chávez Leadership Certificate is designed to introduce students to leadership through the study of the leadership style of César Chávez, California's farmworker movement, and various historical landmarks in the Bakersfield College service region. Since the late 19th century, the southern San Joaquin Valley has been home to migrant agricultural workers from across the globe who have come from varying racial/ethnic and cultural backgrounds. The establishment of the César E. Chávez national monument in Keene, California, marked the significance of this local history within the southern San Joaquin Valley. This program is designed to promote student learning through public history engagement related to local historical landmarks associated with César Chávez and the farm worker movement. The program is also designed to accelerate historical thinking for student participants, as well as promote civic and humanities engagement and the studying historic leadership in the area of labor and civil rights for migrant farm workers.
