SBS PWY Presentation: (Colaw) 7 ADTS plus pre-law pathway Up from pre-covid English and Math 1st year 25% Golden 4: above the college average 15.9% 15+: lower than pre-covid numbers but higher than college (Fall 2020 attempts were higher but not completions across BC) Attempting 30+ units: 16% Persistence: 74.5%, above the college by over 6% Human Services Work Experience: 41 students in the program working now, Sarah Valensuela has partnered with 12 agencies to make these work experience opportunities happen. CSUB panel discussion, Fall 2023 Q& A panel: Psych, Sociology and Social Work MA program. 25-30 students attended. Next panel will be with professionals from the community Career fairs for Social and Behavioral Sciences (Jasmine Gutierrez, job developer CTE)—9 agencies represented, 159 students attended, In addition, 374 students helped in various ways with career development, resume writing and interview prep. <p>What is holding student up from their AATs? Need an online offering for 1 course, students who don't pass Psych B5 can't move forward in several of our degrees. Human Services need to complete the orientation 1 semester before they can do their work experience, this stops students from completing their work experience and they transfer as liberal studies majors instead.</p>	
<p>D. EDU PWY Presentation: (Bligh) Mindy Wilmont, Kimberly Bligh We are in our 6th year as a department. All of our programs other than Early Childhood Education have been developed in the last 5 years. 2 ADTs, over a dozen high unit certificates and several non-credit certificates. 15+ units: decreased in 2022, the discussion revealed the elementary education degree pathway is too prescribed, as a result we developed the education degree. English and Math first year: Decreased by 2-3% Education Pathway ADTs 2-year completion 2nd highest degree completion rates Early College: EDUC paraprofessional Level 1 COA at KHSD 7 campuses and growing, CHDV courses offered at Wonderful and ROC Community Initiatives: EDUC Social-Emotional Cognitive Development COA (Non-credit) with Ceasar Chavez Foundation, CHDV parent university programs (64 parents in last cohort), 3 Certs: Intro to Early Care and Education, Transitional kindergarten and 1 more JSC. EDUC Department Professional Development Opportunities: Applied leadership cert of completion, inclusive and accessible digital content cert, online teaching certs, teaching and learning certs Tutoring Center: 871 enrolled, Panorama, Delano SW, Fall, 2023, 1,489 STARFISH referrals: All referred students receive emails and phone calls from BC Education Faculty to triage students' academic or personal support needs. Students who we can't talk to individually, we send a last-chance Ocelot message. We only close after we talk to student. Summer Bridge: Bridge students succeed at 20-30% higher rates than students who don't complete bridge. 2 year awards: 10% higher Trio SSS: federally funded grant education outreach program, 140 students per year, only 1 year left. We report out on 37 data points on every student in the program. Provides opportunities for low-income, first gen students. Currently hiring new ed advisor.</p>	<p>10 minutes</p>

<p>Peer mentor from Trio shared what they do in Trio. Peer mentors do all the planning and promotion for all events and they run them. They use the activities to have conversations with students one-on-one. LETS Teach Huddles: 6 per semester, LETS teach conference. 600 over the last few years attended online over the last few years. 10-15 per event attend face-to-face.</p>
